ABOUT MISSION COLLEGE



HIGH SCHOOL AND COLLEGE CREDIT

Did you know high school students can earn college credits, while still in high school? And tuition fees are waived? Talk to your school counselor for details and to have them sign off on classes. Many high school students enroll in math, English, computer science, hospitality, graphic design, or business and accounting classes, receiving

hands-on training in a college environment. Students take four or six-week classes during the Winter and/or Summer, or during the semester. Some students have even completed a two-year degree **BEFORE** graduating high school. How does that sound towards future college costs?



In order to receive an early registration date, students must complete the following requirements from steps 2, 3 and 5 by the Priority Registration deadlines: Assessment, Orientation and Educational Plan as well as;

- Maintain good academic standing with at least a cumulative 2.0 GPA
- Complete at least 50% of your enrolled units each semester
- Students with over 100 units are not eligible for priority registration.

PRIORITY REGISTRATION DEADLINES: Summer/Fall 3rd Thursday in March Winter/Spring 3rd Thursday in October
